My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Easter!

As we celebrate the Lord's Resurrection from the dead, I am reminded of a quote I heard from Pope St. John Paul II: "Jesus Christ is the answer to the question posed by every human life." In our relativistic world, we can think there is no answer. In our chaotic, noisy and distracting world, we can even ignore the question!

Yet, the truth is that we each have that question in our being. We want to know the meaning of life, the reason we suffer, why there is anything instead of nothing. We look at our particular lives and wonder if we're an accident or if *my* life has meaning. The answer is "Yes, there is a meaning to my life, to all life. There is a God who has entered our suffering and death and conquered it!" Jesus *IS* the answer to every question!

This is the point of the past week (Holy Week): God entered our humanity and took on all we experience. He walked our walk, talked our talk, lived our life and died our death. He experienced the most extreme physical, mental,

emotional and spiritual suffering known to man. He knows what it means to be betrayed by a close friend. He knows what it means for His love to be rejected by those He loves. He knows the physical suffering that wracks the whole body, leaving one helpless. He knows the anguish and stress of extreme terror, even to the point of sweating blood. He even knows the existential loneliness and spiritual darkness of those who feel abandoned by God. God has entered into all of this Himself. He knows it by experience!

But He didn't just leave it there. He entered into our suffering and then overcame it in the Resurrection. By doing this, He redeemed us – destroying the power of sin, of death, of suffering. Now we can look at our plight in life and know there *is meaning!* Jesus entered into it to give it meaning. He entered even into the smallest and most vulnerable life (that of a zygote) to show us that God wants to unite our lives to His life, that He imbues all of human existence with meaning.

These are generalities, but God doesn't deal in generalities – He loves specifics: this person! He entered our humanity to give *you* meaning, to give me meaning. He is the answer to every problem, every crisis. He is the love of God outpoured through humanity.

The question isn't, "Is there an answer?" The question is whether we will allow Jesus to answer it in our lives. He is pouring out His infinitely passionate, tender and merciful love on each of us, here, now, today. Will we let Him in? Will we allow Him to be Lord of our lives?

As we enter this Easter Season, I invite you to invite Jesus into your life (or re-invite Him in). No matter what the problems, worries or stresses you have in your life, Jesus is the answer... because He is God! May we allow Him to answer the question of our lives.
