My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells us that getting to Heaven is not as easy as we seem to think it is. It seems that most people (most people who believe in God, anyway) think that getting to Heaven is very easy and most people get there, while going to hell is next to impossible, and only those like Hitler and Stalin end up there. When asked directly, however, Jesus replies in a way that shows us it is the exact opposite: "Strive to enter through the narrow door, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough" (Luke 13:24).

"Many ... will not be strong enough." Harrowing words. It makes me wonder, am I strong enough? What do I need to do to be saved?

The truth is, of course, that none of us can save ourselves. St. Therese was once lauded for her great virtue. In a show of impatience, she said (and

I paraphrase), "Oh, it's not that! Our good works condemn us if we rely on them!" We cannot earn Heaven. Only Jesus can earn Heaven for us; only the Cross and Resurrection can save us. No amount of good works or growth in virtue can save our souls. It is only by entering the narrow gate — Jesus Himself — that we are saved.

Being strong enough, then, means not our own strength, but relying totally and constantly and explicitly on Jesus' strength. We must be conformed to Christ in order to enter through that narrow gate. Our good works have a place, however, as they help us to receive His grace and be conformed to Him. On our own, this is impossible, but with God, all things are possible. They're not necessarily easy, but they are *now possible*!

I was reflecting on this recently. In my early days of priesthood, I went into the ER to pray with a family whose young son had a TV fall on his head. As they were stitching him up, he was streaming bloody-murder! With the screaming, I realized I was having a vagal reaction. As the nauseous feeling overwhelmed me, sweat poured out of my body, and I felt lightheaded, I was looking for a place to sit or at least lean against – and I found nothing! I started praying to God, "Keep me vertical!" The last thing the family needed at that point was to deal with a priest passed out on the floor. I kept thinking, "Jesus, take care of this." It took a while, but the reaction finally faded... after the child stopped screaming. I realized that Jesus hadn't taken away the cross of the moment, but He had kept me standing – He didn't suddenly make it easy, but He made it possible for me to remain standing.

In God's mercy, getting to Heaven is not easy, but Jesus's love on the Cross, it is now possible for us. Why is it not easy? Because we keep desiring to be conformed to the world and not to Jesus. If we allow ourselves to be swept up with worldly things, with worldly thinking, with worldly desires, with worldly ways, then we won't be swept up into Christ. To enter the narrow gate means that we need to say "No" to ourselves, to our worldly desires. I'm going to say this straight: The worldly is bring us to Hell! We have to keep our eyes on Heaven when the desire for pleasure or leisure (or whatever else from the world) puts a wedge between us and God, we need to say "No," renouncing it for the sake of the Kingdom. This may be hard. Okay... this is hard! But it is now possible with the grace of God, and it is absolutely necessary for us to enter the narrow gate – Jesus Christ. So, let's ask God to help us through the narrow gate, to reject all within us that rejects God, and so be saved.

ROSARY CHALLENGE

During Lent, the St. Patrick's Mission Team offered a Lenten Challenge that focused on prayer, almsgiving and fasting. Part of this challenge was praying the Holy Rosary daily. We are proud to report that at least 5,000 Rosaries were said during that time! Fortunately, the majority of us (if not all!) found such benefit from our daily Rosaries that we have not stopped! One Rosary prayed is so powerful and to imagine the power of thousands is astonishing. Sister Lucia dos Santos writes, "The Most Holy Virgin in these last times in which we live has given a new efficacy to the recitation of the Rosary. To such an extent that there is no problem, no matter how difficult it is, whether temporal or above all spiritual, in the personal life of each one of us, of our families...that cannot be solved by the Rosary. There is no problem, I tell you, no matter how difficult it is, that we cannot resolve by the prayer of the Holy Rosary." In 1985 Patriarch Bartholomew initiated the liturgical **Season of Creation** in the Orthodox Church.
