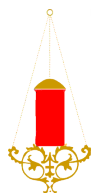

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This month of November is dedicated to praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. These people who died as friends of God, but still had some stain or rust (to use St. Catherine of Genoa's term) on their souls, an effect of sin. As the truth that nothing impure can enter heaven (see Revelation 21:27) meets the longing of God for everyone to enter heaven ("**This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me**" John 6:29, see also I Timothy 2:4), we wonder how God will make this happen. The gift and mercy of Purgatory is that even while we are impure, if we finish our lives on earth in friendship with God, God has a way of purifying us after death. Let us pray for those in Purgatory, asking God's mercy upon them.
