My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We hear today about how Jesus heals Bartimaeus, the blind man. I just want to share some of my reflections on the different parts of the Gospel passage.

First, this story is a reminder that Jesus is the Divine Healer. He came into our humanity to overcome our sin and death so that we can have eternal life with Him. But it's more than just about when we leave this world – He cares for us right here, right now. He heals our sinful souls. He heals our broken hearts. He heals our wounded emotions. He heals our sick bodies. In my experience, I have seen Jesus heal souls far more often the other types of healing, but I have witnessed emotional healing to a great extent, and I have even witnessed miraculous physical healings. He is truly The Healer. Oh, that we would trust Him more to heal what we *need* healed!

Second, Jesus heals Bartimaeus of his blindness. This is a real physical healing of physical blindness, but it also is a sign that Jesus heals our spiritual blindness. How often do I look but not see?! It is so easy to be blind to how God is moving in our lives! It can be incredibly scary not to see God's love! It would mean that we're in this on our own, that we have to fend for ourselves, that everything we have worked for can be taken away in an instant! O, that today we would be able to see His love! Even in the midst of the greatest storms of life, we would find peace! Jesus invites us to surrender that blindness to Him so that He can show us how much love He has for us.

Another reflection is that Bartimaeus is persistent in his plea to Jesus. Even when others tell him to be silent, he keeps crying out to Jesus. Do we have that persistence? When we're in need, do we keep crying out to Jesus, or do we give up, letting our hands fall in?

This questions Jesus asks Bartimaeus is a key question: "What do you want me to do for you?" (Mark 10:51). Jesus cares about our needs, yes, but also our desires. What do I want of Jesus? He *really* wants to know! I think this also indicates that Jesus won't crush our freewill. He wants us to be involved. He wants us to *want Him* moving in our lives. Will we ask Him, invite Him, into our brokenness, our hurt, our woundedness? Sometimes, all He is waiting for is an invitation.

My final reflection on this is about Bartimaeus' faith. He asks to be able to see. He doesn't say, "If you can, I wouldn't mind if maybe you could possibly do something so that I might not stumble around as much, and maybe can have ..." He is direct in asking for the impossible, "I want to see" (Mk 10:51). Boldly, he asks God for the impossible, with trust that He can do it, and that He *wants* to do it. He doesn't demand anything, but he asks boldly, knowing that Jesus wants to answer. Jesus recognizes his faith and heals him, and faith leads not only to Bartimaeus' healing, but also to his following Him. Jesus is inviting us to have faith in Him – faith that asks boldly and follows totally.Let's pray with bold and persistent faith that the Lord will heal our spiritual blindness, and every other infirmity in body, mind and soul.
